As I write this, I am counting the days...the days until I can have an ice cold Coke again! You see, for Lent, I decided to give up soft drinks, ALL soft drinks.

Years ago, I decided to limit my "Coca-cola" habit to just one a day, at lunchtime. And then I realized that when I would go out to lunch, my one Coke would grow with each refill that the waitress gave me. I may have still had the one glass, but it was refilled a couple of times. And then I realized that I would have Sprite for dinner, thinking, "Well, this isn't a Coke, so it is okay for me to have it."

And I would hear the report of how soft drinks were not good for you...yada, yada,yada...That was the point that I would tune out because I would reason "Well, that is my only guilty pleasure. So really, how bad can they be? It is just one...", conveniently forgetting, that my just one was for Cokes and didn't apply to the other soft drinks that I might intake during the day.

Are we holding on to garments that we will never wear again all because we think that one day, we might need them again.

The lesson of our Lenten journey is that God is constantly doing a new thing. God is constantly clothing us with new garments of spiritual growth and discovery.

We can let go of the bell-bottoms and 80's fluorescent shirts that are taking up room in our closets and make room for God's grace, love and peace.

May your Lenten journey be full-filling and spirit-filled!

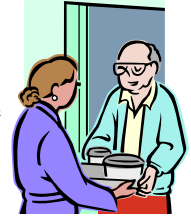
### Mission Night

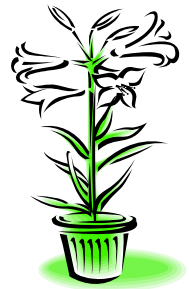
