“The Homeplace” Update

A Continuing Care Retirement Community located beside a private liberal arts college and flanked on its other sides by an elementary school, a city park, a horse farm and a residential neighborhood.

Services:

The proposed menu of settings includes skilled nursing care, licensed personal care, and assisted living. There is no independent living component contemplated due to the limitations presented by the site.

A central element of the program design-closely tied to the structural layout and design-is the elder care philosophy known as the Green House. Christian Care is committed to leading the way among Kentucky’s long term care providers in replicating this model here. Several regulatory variances will be necessary, but the state officials responsible for making decisions about this have indicated their willingness to approve the needed variances. Christian Care also embraces and upholds the importance of sustainable energy design as responsible stewards of the earth, and the project will reflect this commitment as well.

Proposed Program:

Opportunities will abound for residents to participate in lifelong learning programs via the college; for alumni to return to the site of their beloved alma mater; for students in nursing and the social sciences who are interested in elder care to engage in experiential learning programs; for faculty to undertake research projects in the emerging, interdisciplinary field of gerontology. Additionally, the elementary school flanking the other side of the property offers a wealth of opportunities for developing intergenerational programs linking young students with residents in ways that will benefit both. Because Midway College has one of the nation’s most respected collegiate equestrian programs, this sets the stage for possibly developing therapeutic programs connecting residents and horses, too.

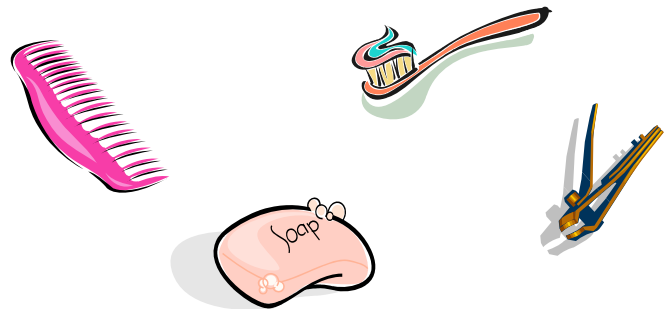

Collecting Hygiene Kits for Church World Service

As residents of Gulf Coast towns in Texas begin to dig out from the devastation of Hurricane Ike, humanitarian agency Church World Service in partnership with Week of Compassion is issuing an urgent appeal for badly needed CWS Kits, and for donations to help purchase recovery supplies locally. Midway Christian Church will be collecting supplies to make Hygiene Kits throughout the month of October to help out with this effort. To assemble a Hygiene Kit you will need:

- *One hand towel measuring approximately 16"x 28"
- *One washcloth
- *One wide-tooth comb
- *One nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards)
- *One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- *One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- *Six Band Aids



Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with zipper closure and include \$2 for shipping.

There will be a basket in the narthex to collect these bags. If you are not able to donate items to make a kit, you can also donate \$11 and the money will be sent to CWS so that they may buy the supplies to fill a kit.
