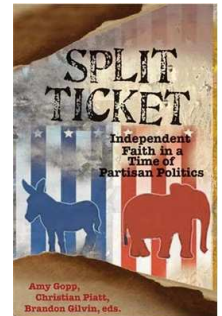

Weekly Youth Groups:

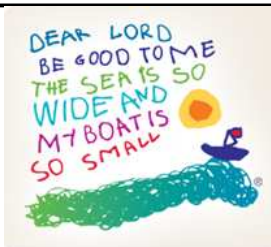
Our JYF (1st-5th grade) continue to meet on Wednesday nights at 6 p.m. There is a snack served as part of our group time together.

October Mission Payment

Hope Ministries Food Pantry: This is a community supported food bank which is available for people in need within our community. It is located at 299 S. Main Street in Versailles. It is open Monday and Friday from 2-4 pm and on Wednesday from 10 am-Noon. In order to obtain food one must first apply at the Community Action Agency. Clients receive a grocery cart containing meat, cheese and butter. They are also able to choose items such as canned vegetables & fruits among other items. The Hope Ministries Food Pantry works with God's Pantry to obtain various food items but relies on community donations for most of the items that fill their shelves.

Hope Center Mission Project



The Hope Center in Lexington serves more than 400 people each day. They are in need of the following items for men:

Razors, shaving cream, soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, combs, deodorant, small towels, washcloths.

Items must be "travel size", as the residents must take them as the leave for the day.

If you would prefer, you can make a donation to the church, with noted for Hope Center project.

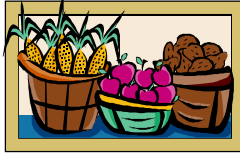

We will be viewing the film "DIRT" followed by a discussion. Please bring a Salad or Sandwiches to share. Drinks will be provided.

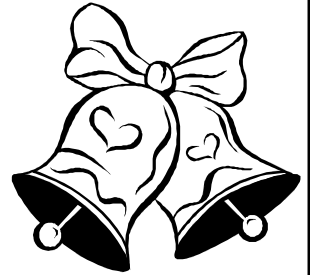

In lieu of gifts, the couple request donations be made to the Scott County or Woodford County Humane Society.



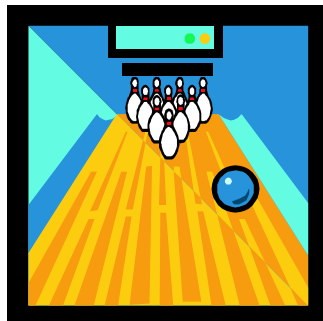
Girls & Guys Night Out

Life Line Screening to be at Midway Christian Church



Wednesday, October 13th, 2010—Fellowship Hall

Midway Christian Church is hosting a community wide health and wellness screening. Life Line Screening will be offering vascular disease screening tests.

Ultrasound will be used to screen for:

- Stroke Screening / Carotid Artery
- Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screening
- Peripheral Artery Disease Screening (hardening of the artery)
- Osteoporosis Screening

The tests are painless and non-invasive. No X-rays, No needles, No hospital gowns! The cost is reduced to less than \$50 each test (\$129 for all four life saving tests). A five year disease risk assessment is also available if requested.

People who should consider these tests are those with these risk factors:

- Family history of stroke or heart disease or aneurysms*
- High blood pressure*
- High cholesterol*
- Diabetic*
- History of smoking*
- Irregular heart beat*

Problems can be detected early before they become life threatening. If you think you are at risk of vascular disease, Life Line Screening would be happy to answer any questions about the tests or help you make an appointment. **Call 1-800-679-5609. (Mention code RES01001).** We do expect to completely fill up, so appointments for the screening are required.
