Midway College: Midway College, formerly the Kentucky Female Orphan School, was the dream of Dr. Lewis Letig Pinkerton, a young physician and minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Together with James Ware Parrish, the Midway Christian Church elder who raised the funds necessary to open the school, they joined with other progressive thinkers to launch a revolutionary educational experiment.

The few girls who received formal education were taught to read only because it was considered necessary for their role as mothers. When they reached adulthood, they would read the Bible to their children.

The college's affiliation with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) remains strong and many members of the student body are active members of Christian Church congregations.

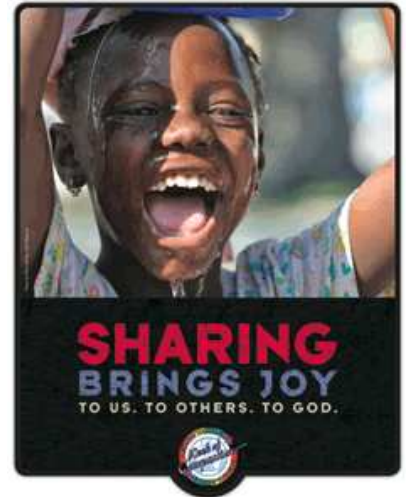
Week of Compassion Special Offering

Caring for God's Creation

An inspiring workshop featuring Dr. Matthew Sleeth

The First United Methodist Church, The First Christian Church, The Green Chalice and Frankfort Climate Action Network are hosting this free afternoon workshop featuring Dr. Sleeth and his wife, Nancy.

In this workshop, Sleeth will talk about our responsibility to care for creation and will share his family's journey to simplicity, stronger relationships, and richer spiritual lives. Beginning by giving away half of their possessions and moving to a house half the size of their former garage, his family found that the more they subtracted, the more they gained in family unity, purpose, and joy. Within a year, they had reduced their electricity use and trash production by nine-tenths and their fossil fuel use by two-thirds the national average. By drawing on religion and science, Sleeth builds a bridge between mainstream Christians and the environmental movement. Dr. Sleeth will begin the workshop by discussing his journey and his book, *Serve God, Save the Planet: A Christian Call to Action*, followed by a presentation and small-group discussion based on "Hope for Creation" the 12-lesson DVD curriculum the Sleeths developed to help church groups explore questions of Christians' responsibilities to the natural world.
