Pastoral Word: Living Into Our New Reality

In many of Paul's letters, he talks about a new creation coming forth. Then later in the New Testament, we hear about a "new heaven and a new earth" come into being after the "first heaven and the first earth" had passed away. These words, which name the newness we often feel as we go through the process of transformation, have been resonating with me for a long time, especially as we continue to reflect on where we have been, where we are now, and where we are going as the community of faith connected with Midway Christian Church.

In some ways, it does feel like we are becoming a new creation, yet I know that what makes us Midway Christian Church - the grace, the love, the call to welcome all, the love of gathering around the Table - all these things continue to remain the same, continue to be true as we continue this journey of transformation.

As many of you know, we resumed in-person worship on Sunday, April 11th, 2021. In many ways, it was like coming home and in other ways, it was a new beginning. I want to say thank you to all who continue to join us online for worship. I want to say thank you to all who are gathering in person on Sunday mornings. The visible expression of this transformation gives hope to me as we begin living into this new creation, into this new reality as a both/and community of faith. We have both a physical presence in Midway, Kentucky, and we continue to connect with others online, some of whom we will never meet, yet they see themselves as an active part of our community of faith.

As part of this new reality, of figuring out how to live into this process of transformation, our thriving congregations team (Ouita Michel, Etta Manor, Shirley Eckels, Jeanne Clark, and myself) continue to meet with our consultant. She has challenged us to embrace technology and explore ways in which we can better communicate with everyone. She has given us direction on how to better connect with everyone through social media. She has also encouraged me to think about how and where I stand on Sunday mornings during worship. You may have noticed that I have not been wearing my robe and that I have been saying the welcome from in front of the communion table. All of this is answering the question: How can we better relate to the people in our pews and the people who are joining us virtually.

Another one of her suggestions to help us capitalize on the momentum of living into our new reality is to hire a virtual assistant. This person would contract with us for three months at ten hours a week. This person would help with our transition from our former website to a new platform which is more mobile friendly. Our goal is to have the new website ready to be revealed the first of July. This person would also help us create a foundation for social media communications. Our team has interviewed a few candidates and we are hopeful that our new virtual assistant will start in May.

The second piece to figuring out how to live into our new reality of a both/and community of faith is hiring someone to run the technology on Sunday mornings. Ray, Dick, and James Batts have done an amazing job. We give thanks for their time, their talents, and their willingness to step in! But we know that they cannot do this type of thing forever. Live streaming has become an important way of how we live out our mission of WELCOME and we want to keep that going.

All this is to say, over the last year, we made investments into our mission of WELCOME and now, we are seeing the fruits of our labor come to fruition! There is this vision, this hope, coming to life! It is exciting to see the many ways God continues to move in and among us, challenging us, calling us to look beyond what we can see and imagine what is possible. I fully admit we still, I still, have more questions than answers, but like our ancestors of faith before us, we are on a journey, becoming the people God created and calls us to be. And there is no more exciting, challenging, renewing, inspiring place I would rather be.

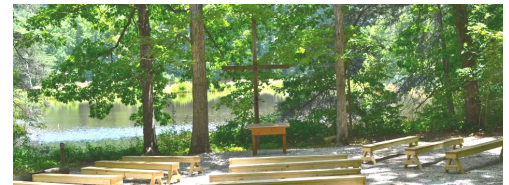

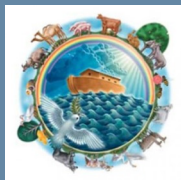


Heifer International Ark Project
